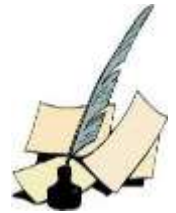

TWO TEMPLE PLACE

John writes:

LALG's London Villages Walks are a must; enjoyable, interesting and well-organised. Last autumn's was around Whitehall, including The Temple area.



Here, Celia led us to Two Temple Place, explaining the building was originally built in 1892 as the estate office of William Waldorf Astor, arguably the richest man in the world. But it is open to the public only when exhibitions are being held.

Later, seeing a textiles exhibition was taking place, along I went. The interior is fascinating, well worth seeing. The visit was enhanced by the helpful guides in each room or area, who provided much interesting historical information.

Perhaps the most outstanding feature of the house is the magnificent staircase, which is of three sections: from one section it is possible to look upwards or downwards to another.

A guide pointed out a carved figure on one banister, the master. On another there is a carving of a boy cleaning the said master's shoes. But perhaps wishing to better himself, the boy has an eye on a book on the master's knee. He is surreptitiously glancing at the master to avoid being caught reading instead of cleaning the shoes.

And then the textiles exhibition! I know little about textiles but thought it would be impolite not to have a quick look at that too. Guess what! I found it most interesting.
